

Time - Sometime around the present.

Mrs Kay, a dedicated and forward-thinking teacher, much liked by her pupils in the remedial class, has decided to take the class for a day out by coach to St Andrews Castle in Fife. The school is in a deprived area and this is a great treat for the children involved as they know little beyond their limited and run-down surroundings. Mrs Kay is joined on the trip by two supportive teachers, Colin and Susan who are also popular with the kids. However, her methods do not meet the approval of all her colleagues. One of these, Mr Briggs, persuades the Headmaster to send him on the trip to "keep an eye on things".

After the bus driver's sympathy for the kids has been won by Mrs Kay the coach sets off, crosses the Forth Road Bridge and after adding a brief toilet stop. pulls up first at a roadside cafe. Here the kids are not impressed with shop prices and allege profiteering but make their own arrangements to get their money's worth. Mrs Kay then takes the class on an unscheduled visit to a zoo but events require her to move them all hurriedly on to St Andrews.

Despite Mr Briggs' knowledge of history the kids are not impressed with the Castle and so Mrs Kay organises them all down to the beach. This proves to be a very eventful part of the day and Mr Briggs' attitude to the kids changes significantly. So much so that he postpones the start of the return journey and takes the whole group to the fair with the highlight being a ride on the waltzer. All too soon it is time to return home and to the harsh reality of inner city life.

NATIONAL OPERATIC AND DRAMATIC ASSOCIATION

THE National Operatic & Dramatic Association was established in 1899 for the express purpose of bringing together members of amateur operatic and dramatic societies for their mutual assistance and combined henefit

The only organisation of its kind devoted exclusively to the amateur stage, NODA now has over 1,700 affiliated societies and over 1,700 Individual Members throught Britain and Ireland.

The Association is a registered charity, owns its own headquarters in central London, and is proud to have Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother as its Royal Patron.

The Association is governed by a Council comprising an elected Councillor from each of the twelve major areas into which NODA divides the British Isles. Each Area is further covered by Regional Representatives who form an Area Committee under the Councillor. Thus NODA reaches out to provide a local and personal service wherever there is an amateur society.

Its headquarters has a knowledgeable professional staff which co-ordinates the administration and provides advantageous trading services for members.

NODA NEWS, published at both national and Area level, provides information of interest to everyone concerned with amateur theatre, including a fixture list and also an 'offers and wanted' section for selling or buying scores, scenery, costumes, props etc.

The National Conference is held at a different centre each year, and there are also eleven Area Conferences. They all provide an opportunity for members to meet

and discuss matters of common interest.

The NODA Operatic Summer School, the NODA Theatre Course and the Technical Summer School. held each year, provide first-class training under highly-qualified professional instructors. Bursaries and scholarships are available, mostly for young people. Weekend Workshops on such diverse subjects as tap dancing, pantomime, lighting and make-up are staged at NODA headquarters and in regional centres.

NODA Long Service Badges and Medals are proudly worn on special occasions all over the UK. They signify distinguished service to amateur theatre.

Whatever is needed for a show, NODA can either provide it or advise on where to get it.

EDINBURGH DISTRICT ARTS COUNCIL

Edinburgh District Arts Council is the first local Arts Council to be established in a Scottish city. Local arts forums are already running successfully in other areas of the country, providing a focus for arts activities within their communities.

The District Arts Council was inaugurated on 28 September 1988, following public consultation throughout Edinburgh. It supports local arts initiatives by:

- * financing local arts projects and activities
- providing a forum for discussion on arts policy and development within the area
- * publishing directories and newsletters * acting as a resource centre, a store of practical help and experise

It is a Voluntary and Independent body. Membership is by affiliation on payment of a fee and is open to all organisations and individuals in Edinburgh who have an interest in the arts. It has its own Constitution but is funded, serviced and actively supported by the District Council's Recreation Department. Paolo Vestri, Recreation Chairman, is the Chairperson. The majority of members come from the arcistic and cultural organisations who have affiliated to the Arts Council and the Executive Committee comprises people who represent areas of interest such as artforms, festivals etc.
