This is the 31st Edinburgh Festivals' Cavalcade. The first one in 1976 was the brainchild of Iain Crawford, the then Marketing Director of the Edinburgh International Festival. At that time the Tattoo had their own parade on the following Monday but under Major Brian Leishman's management of the Tattoo the two parades were combined to make one great cavalcade. The Evening News supported the Cavalcade from the beginning and took over its organisation for a number of years with Wendy Jones at the helm. When Brian Leishman retired as Business Manager of the Tattoo he took on the mantle and after the great success of The Queen's Jubilee Festival Cavalcade in 2002 brought David Todd on as Organiser in 2003. David Todd was Director in 2004 and 2005.
