



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THE EDINBURGH YOUNG THEATRE COMPANY ON TOUR

One of the most interesting developments in the past year has been our visits to take part in Festivals. I now understand fully how comparatively easy it is to stage a show on the Fringe in Edinburgh when it is our home base.

Our first venture took us to Epping in April to take part in the Festival of Youth Drama.

After an all day coach trip to Victoria, A tube journey in the rush hour, a walk round a supermarket to get food for the weekend followed by a "short" walk in the near dark to find the Youth Hostel, we arrived, and were made most welcome along with several other Youth Theatre groups, mostly from the South of England. It was good to work with other Leaders and learn new skills, also to perform a one act play to the other Festival participants.

Our second trip was to the National Youth Arts Festival at Ilfracombe in Devon, and after a minibus trip overnight of 500 miles we arrived in the North Devon sunshine to a fabulous week of varied activities, including a major outdoor project watched by almost the entire population of Ilfracombe.

Meeting other Youth Theatre members, sharing work, exchanging ideas is I believe an important part of our work, and is something to be developed in the future. We have been asked back to Ilfracombe next year and look forward also to attending the various Youth Theatre Forums which are to be organised throughout Scotland by the Scottish National Association of Youth Theatre.

The company, along with around 150 others, entered for the Barclays Youth Music Theatre Awards, and whilst we were not one of the "Top 12"to be chosen for the finals in London, found it a worth while experience (A video recording of "DAVY" was submitted as our entry.

The Pajama Game

THE STORY (The Present)

A strike is imminent at the Sleep Tite Pajama Factory. The Union is seeking a wage rise of seven and a half cents an hour. Sid and Babe are in opposite camps yet a romance is born between them. At first Babe rejects him and Sid is forced to confide his feelings to a dictaphone. During the picnic for the factory workers he makes better progress but their estrangement is reinforced when they return to the factory. A go-slow is staged by the Union, strongly supported by Babe, Sid, as factory superintendent, demands an 'honest day's work' and threatens to fire slackers. Babe is enraged by his attitude and kicks her foot into the machinery, causes a general breakdown and is immediately fired by Sid. Hines, the popular efficiency expert, is in love with Gladys the President's secretary. Periodically, he brings a more optimistic outlook to the life of the factory. Becoming convinced that Babe's championship of the Union is justified. Sid simulates an interest in Gladys by taking her out for the evening to the night club, Hernando's Hideaway, Through her help he is eventually able to gain access to the firm's books and discovers that the boss has been adding to his price the pay increase demanded by the workers. Sid then brings about his boss, Hasler's, consent to a pay rise and is able to bring peace to the factory and to his love life. Everyone goes out to celebrate - at Hemando's Hideaway.

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
