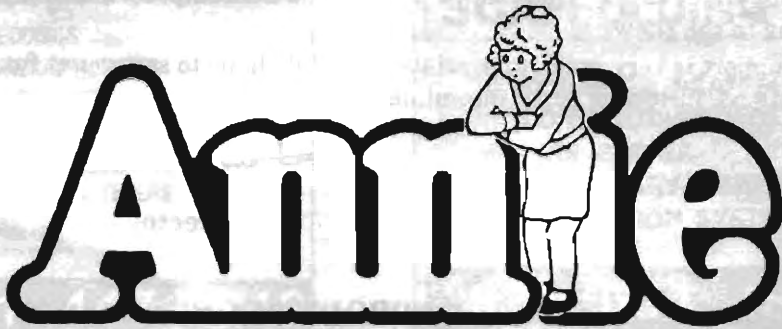

INTRODUCTION

Annie has many names of people, places and things in America which may not be familiar to everybody. These lists might further increase your enjoyment of the musical.

People

- Jack Dempsey was heavyweight boxing World Champion 1919–26.
- Herbert Hoover was US President 1928–32 – blamed for the 'Depression' which put many out of work.
- Franklin Delano Roosevelt (FDR) was US President 1933–36–40–44–45 – he died in office and was the only President elected four times.
- Don Budge – outstanding US tennis player (Grand Slam 1936).
- John D. Rockefeller was a very rich man (Standard Oil, later Esso).
- Mahatma Gandhi was an Indian leader (not Red Indians!) seeking independence from the British rule.
- Harpo Marx was one of four brother comedians – he never spoke.
- Lou Gehrig – of the Yankees (baseball star).
- 'Warbucks' was originally a comic strip character.
- Bernard (Barney) Baruch was an economist and adviser to Democrat Presidents.
- Gershwin – the name of brothers famous for their jazz music and lyrics.
- Kaufman & Hart – wrote Broadway comedy hit shows.
- J. Edgar Hoover – founded the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the 'FBI' – in 1924 to detect crime across the whole United

States – its investigators nicknamed 'G-men'.

- Gunderson – a famous G-man.
- Dillinger – an infamous 'Public Enemy'.
- Calvin Coolidge was President of the USA, 1923–28.
- William Howard Taft was President of the USA 1909–13.
- 'Little Orphan Annie' – an illustration inspiring the show.
- Fred (Astaire) & Adelle were famous dance partners.
- Eleanor (Roosevelt) – wife of FDR.

Places

- Chrysler Building – a NYC skyscraper.
- Coney Island – the Portobello of NYC.
- Teeterboro – a former NYC airfield.
- Bridgeport – a town close to NYC.
- Waldorf (Astoria) – a famous hotel.
- Automat – a self-service cafeteria.
- Leavenworth (Pen = Penitentiary) – a prison for US military offenders.
- Yonkers – an industrial city close to NYC.

Things

- 'Ma Perkins' – a radio soap opera (like Neighbours)
- Greyhound – buses run right across America.
- Precinct – Police Division (Area).
- Tiffany's – a famous NYC jewellers.
- Rumpelmeyers, Bests – New York department stores.
- 'Y' – young persons' hostel.
- New Deal – F.D. Roosevelt's initiative to put people back to work by starting major public projects and Federal relief.
