## YOU'RE DOIN' FINE, OKLAHOMA!

For over half a century OKLAHOMA! has been doin' fine all over the world. More than 26,000 productions have been seen in the United States alone and over six hundred productions are put on in this country every year. When OKLAHOMA! opened on Broadway in 1943 it made history, forever dividing the course of the American Musical into two distinct eras: before OKLAHOMA! and after OKLAHOMA!

Immediately after the show closed on Broadway it set out on a nationwide tour. In Oklahoma, when the show arrived, a state holiday was proclaimed. The final song has now become the official state anthem and Rodgers and Hammerstein were even made honorary Indian Chiefs by the tribes living in Oklahoma.

London, still suffering from post war austerity, gave OKLAHOMA! a tremendous welcome when it opened in the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane on 29 April 1947. At the beginning of Act Two "The Farmer and the Cowman" scene brought the house down and the applause was so great that at the end of the dance the actors had to stop and wait. Aunt Eller shot her pistol in the air to stop the clapping so that the show could continue. OKLAHOMA! was the longest running production in the history of Drury Lane which had first opened its doors in 1663, until "My Fair Lady" broke even this record in 1962.

#### January 26th, 1931

Lynn Riggs' play "Green Grow The Lilacs" is presented on Broadway. Riggs, a native of Oklahoma, drew from childhood memories for detail of how the state was transformed from an "Indian" Territory.

#### Warch 11th-13th, 1943

A 'musical' version of Rigg's play entitled "AWAY WE GO!" by Richard Rodgers & Oscar Hammerstein II has its world premiere at The Schubert Theatre, New Haven.

#### March 15th - 27th, 1945

At the Colonial Theatre, Boston, prior to the shows, Broadway premiere, a second act number is added, entitled "Oklahoma" which stops the show!

#### March 3151 1943

The musical opens at the St. James Theatre on Broadway. With the addition of an exclamation mark the shows name is changed to "OKLAHOMA!".

#### May 29th, 1948

After a record 2212 performances, "OKLAHOMA!" closes on Broadway having been seen by more than 4.5 million people over a 5 year period.

#### April 28th, 1953

The song, "Oklahoma" by Rodgers & Hammerstein is declared the official anthem of the State of Oklahoma.

#### October 11th 1959

The motion picture version of "OKLAHOMA!" is released, starring Gordon McRae and Shirley Jones and directed by Fred Zinneman.





## INTERVIEW WITH THE CHOREOGRAPHER

Name - Jill Cruickshank

At what age did you first start dancing?

I began dancing when I was 6 years old at the Elaine Masson Stagecraft School of Dance in Arbroath.

What was your first "major" musical?

Coincidentally it was the Arbroath Operatic Society production of "Oklahoma!" in 1977.

What was your role?

I played one of the bridesmaids in the dream ballet at the tender age of 10!

Which shows followed "Oklahoma!"?

Since moving to Edinburgh in 1990 I have worked with The Bohemians, Allegro, Showcase, Quinquereme, Footlights and Southern Light Drama. Parts have included Jeannie in "Brigadoon", Minnie Fay in "Hello Dolly", Jane in "Irene", Gladys in "Pyjama Game", Ellie in "Showboat", Amy in "A Girl Called Jo", Susie in "Lady Be Good", Ginger in "The Best Little Whorehouse In Texas" and Pip in "Moby Dick".

Which Tempo shows have you been involved with?

"South Pacific", "Into The Woods", "Guys & Dolls", "I'm Getting My Act Together And Taking It On The Road" and "Space Chase".

Do you have any other shows in the pipeline?

I'm very excited to be playing Eliza Doolittle in The Bohemians 1998 production of "My Fair Lady" and for Tempo's 1998 Fringe show "They're Playing Our Song", I am choreographing and performing on stage.

Who would you say have been your influences in choreography?

I would have to say that June Geissler has been a great source of inspiration, together with The Pavlova Sisters! (And of course Madonna!!!!)

What has been the biggest challenge for you in choreographing Oklahoma?

Everything has gone very smoothly in rehearsals, mainly due to the hard work & commitment of the company. But the greatest challenge has been coping with the 'Prima Donna' who went to Kansas City !!!

## SOON BELIVIN'IN A BRAND NEW STATE

Oklahoma is located near the central part of the United States. It ranks 20th in size amongst the states and is bordered by Kansas and Colorado on the north, by New Mexico on the west and south and by Missouri and Arkansas on the east. Indians lived in, and migrated back and forth across, what is now Oklahoma as they bunted for animals and food. The earliest people lived there some 15,000 years ago.

In 1803 the United States purchased the Louisiana Territory from France and the "Panhandle" was added to Oklahoma Territory in 1890.

Oklahoma was formed by the union of Indian Territory and Oklahoma Territory, as the 46th state of the U.S.A. Its early history, after the Indians were forced to give up their lands, saw great rivalry between the small farmers, growing a variety of crops, and the ranchers (the 'Cowmen') specialising in animal production.

Since Statehood many changes have taken place and Oklahoma has changed from a rural to an urban state. Its population has increased with each census apart from the years of the Dust Bowl and the Depression of the 1930s
